On behalf of the South Carolina JCI Senate, we proudly host the US JCI Senate Winter Board Meeting in Greenville SC. This will be the first occasion for the US JCI Senate to have a meeting in Greenville. We are happy to share our beautiful city with each of you.

#### Gentle reminders:

Our host hotel is the Embassy Suites Golf Resort located at 670 Verde Blvd. Greenville 29607. Our room rate is \$132.50 plus tax per night. Unfortunately, we have had some confusion within the hotel reservation system. The hotel has to manually add ten rooms each time we hit our room block. While we are beyond excited that we have hit our target goal for rooms, we continue to be given additional rooms in increments of ten. My apologies to those of you who have called and been told that we were out of rooms. Our deadline for reservations is December 18, 2023. If you should experience any challenges in booking your room, please contact me on 864-325-9813. Our contract with the hotel affords our guests the same room rate as the convention for three days before and three days after our meeting. Once you arrive the hotel will manually change your room rate for the additional days. Please remember your credit card is not being charged in advance of your arrival.

Your convention registration is due and must be postmarked no later than December 10, 2023. If you are using PayPal there is an additional charge of \$4.95. Come join your friends and have a great time in Greenville.

If you are driving into Greenville SC, there are no parking fees at the hotel. If you are flying into Greenville, you should make your accommodations to arrive at the Greenville Spartanburg International Airport (GSP). Once you have booked your flight, please let us know so that we can have a hotel shuttle waiting for you. Again, there will be no cost for the shuttle service.

Our hotel is located at a golf resort. While there will not be a golf tournament, there will be a golf play available. Our typical temperatures in January are rarely below 50 degrees.
